District Goals

- All PK-2nd grade students in Mason County will grow a minimum of 5% in mathematics and ELA from BOY 2020 to EOY 2021 as measured by ELRS, mCLASS, and DIBELS individual grade level reports.
- All 3rd-12th grade students in Mason County will grow a minimum of 5% in mathematics and ELA from BOY 2020 to EOY 2021 as measured by WV/GSA Comprehensive Interim Assessments and Math and ELA county benchmarks.
- All Mason County Schools will have a yearly attendance rate of 93% or higher.

School Goals

All students at Point Pleasant Primary School will show a minimum of 10% growth in Reading/Language Arts as measured by DIBELS by the end of the 2020-2021 academic year.

All students in Point Pleasant Primary School will show a minimum of 10% growth in Math as measured by mClass by the end of the 2020--2021 school year.

In Our Classroom

* Teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in the state adopted standards for reading & math.

* During instruction, teachers will utilize strategies which produce high levels of student engagement.

* Each teacher will provide homework which supports topics learned at school.

* Students with positive attendance and a "ready to learn" disposition will be rewarded.

* Teachers will stay in touch with parents about individual student progress.

* Teachers will provide a parent workshop to help parents understand how to support learning at home.

Point Pleasant Primary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success in reading & math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

* Parents will read with children every week and ask questions about books and stories your child is reading.

* Parents will encourage participation in learning activities, obtaining a library card, playing board games, reading, and cooking together.

* Parents will encourage positive attendance habits and support a "ready to learn" disposition in their child.

* Parents will stay in touch with teachers about their child's progress.

* Parents will limit TV time at home.

* Parents will be involved with their child's education by utilizing two-communication
